

RE: Abusive behavior towards the elderly in a Community Scheme.

- Various laws and regulations in South Africa protect the elderly in retirement schemes against verbal abuse.
- These laws aim to ensure the well-being and dignity of the elderly in retirement schemes and to prevent any form of abuse or mistreatment.

- Furthermore, the Constitution of South Africa also guarantees the rights of the elderly in retirement schemes. Section 10 of the Constitution states that everyone has inherent dignity and the right to have their dignity respected and protected.
- This includes the elderly in retirement schemes who have the right to be treated with respect and dignity and to be free from verbal abuse.
